his wife the said M. Howbold hath most inhumanly with out cause abused my body with stripes
the matter of which one time was shown to me Edward by me, his wife two days before he
was freed he inhumanly stripped me, and lashed me to the wall post, where he striked fifty lashes
from him with an unreasonable heave whips, witnessed by severall white hats made me unfit
for labour or travill at present may it therefore please your worships seriously to consider my wrongs
and order M. Howbold and order M. Howbold to restore me my things and satisfaction for my abuses
renewed, and your Honours shall ever pray — no result.
