Howbold seven years faithfully & honestly, according to my condition, and now having a discharge
from him for my service, he doth notwithstanding from me my axe and tools and part of my apparel &
his wife the said Mr. Howbold hath most inhumanly with out cause abused my body with stripes
the matter of which one time was shown to me Edward by me, his wife two days before he
was freed he inhumanly stripped me, and laid me to the wall post, where he striked fifty lashes
from him with an unreasonable heavy whips, witnessed by severall white hats made me unfit
for labour or travell at present may it therefore please your worships seriously to consider my wrongs
and order Mr. Howbold and order Mr. Howbold to restore me my things and satisfaction for my abuses
renewed, and your petitioners shall ever pray — no result.
