Pet. Adams. do Offer the said Pet. to give security for his good behavior during pleasure
whereupon James the said Pet. Adams. the 4th of December did confess him self to be most bound under
Herr Ma. in the sum of ten pounds sterling money to be paid upon his goods (that he) to whom
also same his survivor viz. George: Donahue and Thomas Ewlen and his wife confess them
selfes to be most bound in the sum of five pounds a piece to be paid as above for Herr Ma. upon
the condition of which Recognition is set forth that if the above named Pet. Adams goe of his good be
havior and abearance to all Herr Ma. George Cooper of this Province, but more especially to Samuel:
Hopydon during his Courts pleasure then this Recognition to be void, otherwise to remain in full
force and vertue.
