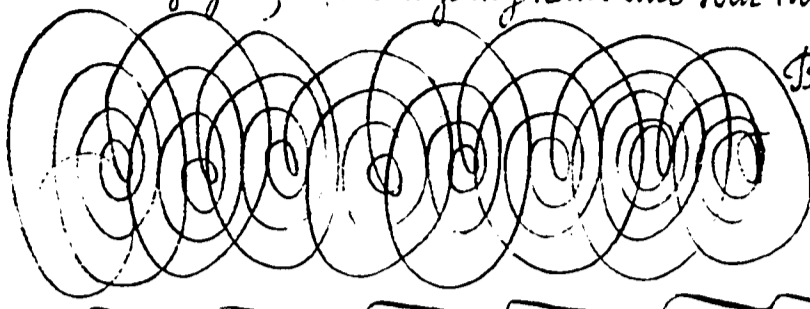


I now all men by these presents that Benjamin: Barde of the County of Somerset in the Province of Maryland

or the Child, which was left to your Petitioner's choice so your petitioner requests Order for the
Child that he may have it. according to law a servant & y^e petitioner shall ever pray &c.
