

These are to Certifie all whom it doth Touch, that Cap. William Rounde
of the Reth Snow Hill Merch^t, Built in ~~the Province of Maryland~~ ^{New England} arrived here
in this County from the Island of Barbados, Saint Vincent in June last past
and did here unload and put on shore, Thirty One Barrels, four quarters and two
hogheads of Rhu, seven barrels and two half barrels Sugar: Thirteen barrels
and six hogheads of Molasses; two hogheads of salt, three pebbles of Cotton
wool; two small bags of Salted Ginger; and five Negroes, and did personally
make his appearance in open Court in the County aforesaid, and made oath that
he entered and cleared the said Reth and goods in the Island aforesaid, according
to Law) and brought a Cert. for the same, from under the ^{Mag^{ist}} Courts hands
and seals there, bearing date the 18th May 1689. Which Certificates the said Wm. Rounde
made oath that he do. to William: Dylward, the Navall Officer for the time then
being. w^{ch} said Com: Dylward refused to enter the said Reth in their Ma^g Courts, and
also to give the said Rounde a Cert. for the clearing his Goods w^{ch} Statute, w^{ch} the
said Rounde gave in the Island aforesaid, and likewise that the said Dylward did
keep the Originall Certificates in his Custody and further sayeth that William Rounde
Signed by Order of the Hon^{ble} the Court of Somerset County in the Province of
Maryland in Court sitting this 15th Jan^y. 1689:

house yesterday, but being altogether a stranger in this County, it happened that your Petitioner lost his way w^{ch}
rendered him incapable of presenting him self before your Worship, and for his own appearance your Worship
was pleased to lay a fine upon your petitioner. Now your petitioner presents him self before your Worship and
humbly desires that your Worship would be pleased to remit and take off the fine aforesaid, and your Petitioner
in duty bound shall humbly pray &c. Whereupon the Court did grant the aforesaid Petition

To the Hon^{ble} Court of Somerset County the humble petition of Jane Cooper Widow of Samuel Cooper

That whereas your petitioner's husband hath been dead almost this three years, and the late Comissionary having granted
granted letters of Administration to George Layfield Esq. with Comission to C^o. William Coulbourn to swear the
said Administrator, and in Francis: Goutherie, and Cap. William: Wittington, Appraisers of the Estate of the
said dead, and the said Coulbourn having not yett called the said deid. and appraisers before him as by the said
Comission of Admin. he was required so that the Estate of the said deceased still remaind unadministred, and one of
the Appraisers being a principall Creditor hath refused the same Office of Appraiser whereby your petitioner
is unable of recovering any part of her deceased husband's Estate (if any be) and the Creditors of the said
deceased are still out of their just dues, and whereas the Probatt of Wills and granting ad in re
