appeared in Court Sarah Ward servant woman to John King being presented by the Grand Jury the Tuesday in March for Bawling, and being duly examined by the Court openly confessed that and saith that Joseph Elder is the father of her Bawling Child. for which offence the said humbly begs their worship to remit corporall punishment and that a fine may be taken was granted by the Court, she giving security for forty days work and dyet when demanded by us also for her good behaviour and Court charges, and that she should appear next Court there to vouch Joseph Elder. And thereupon saith John King and by Recognizants did himself to the Court, for the said Sarah's performance as above.

At the County N. The Jurors for their Ma<sup>ties</sup> being sworn upon the holy Evangelists at a Grand Jury hold for the Body of this County the second Tuesday in November last past do present and find that Katherine Cully woman servant to Walter Lord of this County hath most wickedly sinfully and shamefully committed fornication and at our birth bore two Bawling Children being the same offence. to the great dishonour of Almighty God, great scandal and evil example of their Ma<sup>ties</sup> good people and against the laws and institutions of this Province their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Attorney Generals judgment may be ordered, against the said offence according to law in that behalf made and provided. For said Indictment being read before the Prisoner at the Bar, who pleads not guilty to the Indt. but she is married to one Bryan Kelly about three months ago. and the said Bryan then appearing to the same, as also to be the father of these two Children (which Children) was adjudged to be six months old. And for which said offence the Court ordered them to pay thirty days work and dyet, but want of security, the Court then ordered them thirty lashes a piece to be well on their bare backs, which by the Sub Sheriff was executed.

At the County N. The Jurors for their Ma<sup>ties</sup> being sworn upon the holy Evangelists at a Grand Jury hold for the Body of this County the second Tuesday of November last past, do present and find Daniel M. Glanham, and James both of this County, upon the Oath before their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Proclaiming any fears of God before their eyes, but most wickedly shamefully and sinfully with rate did commit that abominable and heinous sin of Drunkenness upon the fourth of September to the great dishonour of Almighty God, abuse of their bodies the scandal and evil example of good people of this Province and against the laws and institutions thereof. their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Attorney Generals judgment against the said Daniel and James according to law. James Sawyer Esq. Jud.

For foregoing Indictment being read before the Prisoners at the Bar, both pleads not guilty of the Indt. Only Ma<sup>tie</sup> Glanham confesses to be drunk for which he was ordered to be fined according to Act of Assembly. No substantial Evidence appearing, the Court ordered both the said Daniel and James to give security for good behaviour during pleasure, and Court Charges.

Whereupon saith Cap. John Windice, and did acknowledge himself to be indebted unto their Ma<sup>ties</sup> for a sum of ten pounds sterling money to be levied on his goods and Chattle.

The condition of which Recognizance is such that if the said Daniel be of good behaviour and abstinence to all their Ma<sup>ties</sup> joyed people of this Province, then the said acknowledgment or Recognizance to be void otherwise to be and remain in full power force and virtue, and the said Daniel was likewise bound in twenty pounds as above.

And saith Thomas Lee and William Croy and obliged themselves above for James Lees's behaviour and Court Charges.
