

4. Lyne Mr. Justice.

January 16 M<sup>r</sup> 1689.

The Cor. Com<sup>s</sup> of Somerft. the humble Petition of Henry Lyne M<sup>r</sup>. humbly sheweth  
that whereas John: Copepe late of this County deceased in his life time stood indebted  
to your petition. the just sum or quantity of four hundred thirty seven pounds of pock  
which he hath not paid whereupon your petition humbly recd<sup>e</sup> Order against Jn: Franklin  
who married the administrat<sup>i</sup> of the goods and chattels of the aforesaid John: Copepe  
deceased. And as in duty bound shall pray.

u. Being The original of the above said Petition was mentioned to Batt<sup>e</sup> according to Oath  
made before M<sup>r</sup> Robert King, and Order was likewise granted for tobacco.

But in halfe an hour Com<sup>s</sup> Thomas Pool with the aforesaid Petition writing he had  
allowed, and turned the word tobacco, into poore, by interlarding in the same petition.  
The wife Henry: Lyne in persona affirms that the above said amount was poore  
due to her. and that the mistake might probably be in M<sup>r</sup> King, and therefore humbly  
prayed the Courts Consideration for the same. where her wife the said Lyne offered to  
swear the same. viz that every particular article in the above said amount was due to  
her poore, and that she had not receid any part or portell thereof. which oath was so taken  
the said Lyne deponent. And therefor Ordered that the above said sum in the sum  
of aforesaid be only paid in poore viz four hundred thirty seven pounds to be  
paid by John: Franklin.

Item Borrowgood and John: Gayle acknowledged to the Court to be indebted by way of  
guizance unto their Ma<sup>ts</sup> in the sum of ten pounds of man and Jacob: Martin in 20. Sterling  
Pounds to be paid to the condition of the above said recognizance. It is sure that if the above bound Jacob  
be of good behaviour and assurance to all his Ma<sup>ts</sup> bieng people within this Province, that  
this recognizance to be void and of none effect otherwise to be and remains in full power  
and effect.
