To the two the Commissioners of Somerset County the humble of Henry Smith M^r
 sheweth that John Copper was indebted unto your poeple the sum of £2444
 and Caste as per and accepted by him charged upon him by John Roads y^r poeple
 & made an Order against the said John Copper for the above sum of two thousand
 four hundred forty and four pounds to tobacco and Caste and y^r poeple shall pay the
 same to John Copper or other two thousand four hundred forty and four pounds
 of tobacco and Caste it being the Gallant of an other Court obtained agt the estate of John Roads
 of late, your loving friend John Roads. inc.

14 June 1682: c Accepted from John Copper.

Received of John Copper the sum of two thousand four hundred forty pounds of tobacco
 upon the ac^t of w^r John Roads Gray and this 3^r of July 1682: Henry Smith

Thomas Pool sonne made Oath in Open Court that the said John Copper did
 affaine payment after date of this last retell of the above sum of £2444
 of tobacco, wh^t by the Court was weighed and considered to be justly due to
 the said Smith and the whereupon the Court Orders the said John Roads
 of John Copper to pay the same.

Cap Henry Smith required a Copie of the Order of Court agt his said Due to be drawn
 out and sent him upon Court day wh^t was done wh^t proceedings in short
 was as follows:

Maryland Somers^r Et a County Court held by their Majesties Justices of the Peace

this 13th day of March in the year 1689 are Cap Henry Smith in presence present
 per poeple sues to the Court for an Order agt the said John Copper
 defrauded for £2444 of tobacco and Caste, wh^t sum aforesaid the said Smith makes
 appear to be just and due, bote by Oath and under the said Copper's hand as upon
 record doth more amply appear, and therefore the Court having Considered y^r premises
 doth Order the said John Copper to pay the above sum viz 2444 pounds of tobacco and
 Caste to the said Smith.

Somerset County and Edward Evans of this County was attested to and before this Court by
 Sir Majoris^r Justices of the Peace in Court sitting the 13th of March 1689 what shall be observed
 agt him in behalfe of their Ma^r d^r of the Senate and upon the 25th day of
 February last past his said Sonn^r at his house in Newmarket to admiralitie did most shamefully
 maliciously by word & abuse their Ma^r Commissioner for this County calling them Rogues & scoundrels
 & for whipping his servant, and than and there did call their Oath in question, averring that
 he done more then they could answer, and for their injustice done said he would have satisfaction.
 & only satisfied with his abuse and vilifying language agt the whole Court in generall, but in
 the of Cap David Brown and m^r William Brewton. The said Sonn^r did then call the said Cap
 Brown as Judge of their Ma^r Court for this County with other abuse and scurrilous language
 & venomous and spitefull att that time he could invent or imagine, calling the said Brown Rogue
 & scoundrel and insinuating him into detraction. H^r Mr. Attorney came and said that the said
 & that not only vilified and abused their Ma^r said Commissioners of this Court but called their Justice
 & law in question contrary to law and repugnant to that sound maxime de fide et officio Magistratus
 arguendum, but also by his example of abusing the Court, giveth occasion to the good people
 to conceive the authority and the people of this Province, also to despise the
 Treaty to the broad^r both of the said Laws of God and wholesome Laws and institutions of this
 land, and law^r judgment may be enforced agt the said Offender according to Law &c.

The deposition of Joseph Taylor M^r. Sonny at the house of Sonn^r Evans upon
 day of February last or there abouts witnessd by Cap. David Brown and m^r William Brewton
 he in admiralitie saw the said Evans, in a most rude and shamefull manner, by words abuse
 to Cap. Brown and Brewton calling them Rogues. Rascals and fools for whipping his ser-
 vant, than that they and the Court had done more then they could answer, and for wh^t injurie
 & would have satisfaction both of them and the Court. H^r Mr. Attorney would gladly have
 added the said Evans to a forborne his viles and rude language, but the more he would have pursued
 with the said Evans porfessed in his unworthiness, so farre as he could possibly may in other
 w^t this and might were your deponent heard the said Evans say to the same effect. And the
 morning Cap. Brown not going out of bed so soon as company wh^t was there, evanly
 made after the said Cap. the said Evans immediately replyed (saying) I am him bed in bed
 in eye and reth and dye and perish like a Rogue as he is and further your depon^r says not
 in nowt to before the Magistrate herein specified
