

Somer set for *Memorandum* that about sixpence or eightpence days since, *James: Sal and me*
 this Complaint to *James: Sal and me* out of his *Master Justice* of this County that he had about four days
 before lost three hogs and did suppose they were stolen and did thereupon desire a warrant to
 seize for them in all suspicious places which was granted him, and through the diligence of
William Smith the said *James: Sal and me* did depose *Richard Warren* to execute the said warrant upon the
 returns of the warrant the said *Richard Warren* did inform the said *James: Sal and me* that they had searched
 three houses but found no *Richard Warren* and that *Burrougham* was one of the three: no body being
 at home but the woman, and that this day (to wit) the 1th of February 1689. *Matthew Jones*
Warren was *William Gould* *Bridges* did thereupon the said *James: Sal and me* assault the said *Warren*
 giving him several blows on the face and that for no other reason, but his testimony the said
Warren to him directed to him *Richard Warren* as appeared by his own Confession and two
 substantial evidences proving the same and thereupon the said *Matthew Jones* did
 recognize to have *Master Justice William and Susan Mary* in the sum of ten pounds lawfull
 money of England and likewise *Laurance Crawford* did enter into recognizance for the
 like sum and condition. The condition of the above recognizance is such
 that if the above bounden *Matthew Jones* do personally appear at the next Court to be
 holden for this County and there do stand by all and to promise above mentioned and also
 abide judgment according to law that then this recognizance to be void and of none effect
 or else to be and remain in full power force and virtue. Witness our hands and seals
 this fifth day of February 1689

Matthew Jones Confesseth y^e fact and thereupon referred him self
 to the next Court. Whereupon the Court ORDER that *Matthew Jones* pay
 thirty dayes work and dytt to the great *Bridges* minding
 all *Coronets*, as also be of good behaviour duringe Court
 pleasurs and pay Court Charges all to the use of the said *Bridges*

And thereupon came *John: Franklin* and *William Hobbitt* and by recognizance
 of 5th sterling money a piece and *Matthew Jones* in 10th sterling did acknowledge
 them being indebted to their *Malice*.
 The condition of which recognizance is such that if the said *Matthew Jones*, be it and truly
 performs the above work and dytt as also be of good behaviour to all their *Malice*
 sixe people of this Brevice, as also pay Court Charges then this recognizance to
 be void otherwise to be and remain in full power force and virtue.
