Gentlemen Yo^r by Capt^a Browne I haue perused and wonder that both the Civil & military officers of yo^r County being armed with soe ample authority (by the ordinance of Assembly) to suppress all disloyall practises against their Majesties; you haue so long neglected the calling to account Capt^a Huntington whose practises of y^e nature are here too frequently discouer'd of to the ill example of others, ab you haue hitherto beeene very loyall doe hope you will still continue; the w^t you cannot better manifest then by giving as speedy chace to his disloyall practise remouing him from his office, & placing one more loyall in his roome the which of the Commission I approve of I cannot advise to abetter then Capt^a Smith, understanding y^e chace military officer here hath writ at large to you shall ad noe further but that I am Gentleman yo^r Humble servant Kenelme Chese^d 1609

Gent^m I haue asummons from d^r suprem^e Authority so^r y^e insight haue all this Province I cannot attend altho^rgh at this time I haue a small intermission to visit this bus^s so Confus'd through the major part of last nights meeting & want of rest y^e it is agreat doubt whether there may be any forme or yet so farre am capabell to answe what is laid to my charge this m^r briefly so soone ab I haue frane Proclaiming thence ha^r (as I was by good information tolde them they selfe had sent a Packet to this Province wherein) consider^d so much of their loyall pleasure was made knowne ab wee might knowe y^e Government should consider the consent wherof wee haue not bin thought worthy to knowe but if any thing had bin contained that might haue tendencie to the subversion of y^e authority formerly no^r done but it had bin published w^t if to the contrary I cannot see well how I can be deffended from the tresp^s formerly imposid more especially if y^e Laws inserted in y^e late ordinaunce relating to y^e Continuance of the officers be considered I thinke w^t it can be knowne that d^r himselfe could ser^e without taking the usuall oath y^e law provides so^r to be consider^d since their most gracious Majest^e hath not dissented to the late government under y^e Lord Baltimore (by any waies ab wee can understand) they affirme for y^e lawes sake I had rather ser^e the precept bearing the stile Royall than any other I cannot doe without an d^rly springing from y^e lawes as I haue the King but notwithstanding if wee haue any wrong be taken ab^r y^e might bring
