 Now all men by these presents that I John Carlson of the County and Beas aforesaid do hereby certify  
 unto theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> in the sum of ten pounds Sterling good lawfull money of England to preserve Henry  
 Hayman in theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> suits at the next Court held for Somerset County, & upon under my hand the 12<sup>th</sup>  
 day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand six hundred sixty and nine

 That this day 12 of November in the first year of King William and Queen Mary over England  
 Scotland France and Ireland defended of the faith &c. Henry Hayman of Wiltshire in the  
 County aforesaid Cooper made his personall appearance before us John Under Just of theire  
 Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justices of Beas for the County above said and did acknowledge himself to be indebted unto theire  
 Ma<sup>ties</sup> the sum of ten pound of good lawfull money, and Robert Court and Sampson Lowe of Wiltshire  
 in the County aforesaid and did acknowledge them selves to stand indebted to theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> in the sum of  
 five pound a peere of theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> lawfull money of England whiche to severall times they and every of  
 them do acknowledge to owe and stand indebted to theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> to be payed upon their Lands and Tenements  
 The Condition of this above written Recognizance is such that if the above bound Henry Hayman  
 do personally appear before our Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justices of the Beas at the next Court held for the  
 County of Somerset aforesaid and there and there to answer unto such matters as shall be offered  
 ayt him on the behalfs of theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> by John Carlson, and further do stand to abide  
 to such judgments as shall be given by the Justices then sitting, then Recognizance to  
 be void and of none effect, or otherwise to remaine and abide in full force and virtue

The Jury being returned whose verdict is as follows: On All the Jurors and  
 Henry Hayman guilty of lolling up hoggs in the woods whiche was not his Owe and  
 keeping at them William Syper. forman and the Court Order the said  
 Henry Hayman to give security for his good behavior and appearance every Court during  
 the Courts pleasure, as also for Court Charges.  
 And thereupon came John Goldsmith and William and by Recognizance ownde to be  
 justly indebted to theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> the sum five pound Sterling money to be payed on their goods  
 Chattels and Tenements and the said Hayman in ten pound of theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> money aforesaid.

The Condition of the Recognizance is such that if the above bound Henry Hayman be of the good  
 behavior to all theire Ma<sup>ties</sup> Liege people of this Province during the Courts pleasure, as also  
 that he pay Court Charges that then this Recognizance to be void and of none effect other

 humbly sheweth to your Worshipps that lately Thomas Cyear and John Bonnet late turned  
 the County pate leading from the firm for lower Plantation to the ward of St. Bridges lately  
 published by George Condemning, and filled up said pate with trees flowers and fables to  
 so that no person is for persons about their Lawfull Occasions. May it therefore please  
 your Worshipps to Order it so as said Cyear and Bonnet may forthwith have it pat and  
 your Solicitors shall pray.  
 This Petition was read immediately

To the Cor. Justices of the Beas for Somerset County the humble Petition of Samuel Herry  
 sheweth that whereas your Solicitor hath a servant woman by name Ann Buller whiche  
 hath had a bastard Child in your Solicitors house of theire service, soe that your Solicitor  
 humbly craves your Cor. Order for the loss him besides the nursing of the Child one  
 year and halfe, whiche your Solicitor craves your Corships against the said Ann Buller  
 and your Solicitor as in duty bound shall ever pray.  
 Above said Petition being read the Court Order that the said Ann Buller pay unto Samuel Herry  
 hundred pounds of tobacco for the Childs nursing and labours, six hundred more for the  
 and accommodations till June, as also Order that the said Ann give the said Samuel good Security for  
 payment of twelve hundred pounds.

 amount was part of pay for a servant he bought of Cap. Hadd, when the very auct. doth show that it was for  
 more. Your Solicitor labours sayeth, that he did affirm y petitioners ayt would own the amount that it was for  
 your petitioners can Evidence the copy of it to the Lyng, before your petitioners craves your worshipps to consider  
 that your Order is not to surpris or your petitioners pay part for tobacco and shall ever pray
