 Cowford and Samu. Hopkin, Arbitrators indifferently betwixt us the persons aforesaid, to hear arbitrators and
 Judge of the said Controversie relating to wages and Customs claimed by the said Abraham of and from him the
 said Haslewood, and to the said Arbitrators, and their Arbitrament use the said parties, do by this present wholly
 give our selves obligeing and bind us our selves, Exors and Heirs to ratify and observe in the full sum of
 thousands pounds of to be paid to stand unto and abide: the Arbitrators final award and judgment of the said
 Arbitrators. In witness whereof we the said persons in Controversie at a foresaid have hereunto put our hands

All Christian People before whom this present writing of Award shall come, Wm. Round
 Thomas: Durvall John Cowford and Samu. Hopkin, Arbitrators indifferently chosen & elected
 by Abraham Kneet and Cayborne Haslewood, Maryward, to Arbitrate, Judge determine & finally to
 and settle difference and Controversie as have been had moving and depending betwixt the said parties
 relating to wages and Customs due to the said Abraham. Now know ye that we the said Arbitrators having
 deliberately heard the allegations of the parties in Controversie aforesaid and having debated weighty
 and considered thereof the said. With doo Arbitrators, Judge and Award as followeth, to wit that the said
 W. Haslewood shall pay or cause to be paid, unto the said Abraham his wages and his Customs according to
 the bargain and agreement made in Barbados for the whole time of his the said Abrahams service with the
 the said Haslewood, until the time of the said Abrahams discharge and departing or sailing his
 employment, we finding that the said W. Haslewood took no due Care according to the Law of the said
 Province to correct the said Abrahams Misdeameours and qualified him for future service in his voyage
 back to Barbados. Also we the said Arbitrators, doo, determine and judge that the said Haslewood and
 Abraham doo bear and pay their just moyses and equal proportions of their Cost and Charges
 of their Arbitrament the premises is the final award of us the Arbitrators aforesaid in witness whereof
 and seals this 9th day of June 1688.

 William: Lyon. Samu. Collins. Mary Hopkinn. Tho. Ralph. Tho. Cull. Jm. Starbrough
 George Doffman. Myler Jey. Wm. Elgals. Simon Corbin. Wm. Bonab. Tho. Morris. who
 having thoroughly understood understood the whole proceedings and goodly to determine the affair
 they do say the virtue of the matter doo being in this following verdict and all
 the Jurors find that W. Haslewood pay unto Abraham Kneet the full share of
 his account proved in Court Wm. Lyon for man.
 Abraham Kneet engaged to Court not to take out Execution till August the 1st next against
 the Bail Bond for 10. 17. 6. & 150 to be paid being the full amount due for.
