Mr. Wells, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the following bills:

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize J. McCauley, ex'tr of E. Galloway, late of Cecil county, deceased, to pay to S. W. Van Culin, executive officer of the Disciples Church of Philadelphia, a legacy bequeathed to the poor of said church;

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 5, of Article 1, of Local Laws relating to Deer, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

Reported them without amendment, and,
