Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Wells, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill to amend section 10, article 2, of the Constitution of the State;

Reported it with an amendment in the form of a joint resolution, proposing to amend the tenth section, of Article 2, of the Constitution.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Wells, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill, to amend the thirty-first section, of Article 26, of the Public General Laws entitled, "Corporation;"

Reported said bill "ought not to pass."

The report was adopted, and the bill rejected and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wells, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which leave was granted, reported a bill explanatory of the acts of 1865, chapter 6, and 1864, chapter 194, and to impose storage upon certain tobacco now exempt therefrom;

Which was read the first time.
