

On motion of Mr. Tome,

Leave was granted the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to incorporate the Cecil and Hartford counties' Boom company.

On motion of Mr. Whitney,

Leave was granted Messrs. Whitney, Eaton and Turner to report a bill to provide for the deepening of the Harbor of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Turner,

Leave was granted the Committee on Corporations to report a bill supplementary to an act, entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Ben. Franklin Fire Insurance company."

On motion of Mr. Tome,

Leave was granted the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill to amend and re-enact section 13 of article 29 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the inspection of records by the judges of the several counties.
