On motion of Mr. Tome,

Leave was granted the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill to fix the compensation of Crier to the Court of Appeals.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates, January 12th, 1866.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body the appointment of a joint committee of seven, four on the part of the House, and three on the part of the Senate, to report a bill for the general revaluation and reassessment of the real and personal estate of the several counties of the State and the city of Baltimore.

We have appointed on the part of the House Messrs. Markey, Smith of Allegany, Miller of Anne Arundel, and Cook.
