5th:

Special direct:

When Clement M. Wright applied to your Board for registration, were you present; if yea, state all that occurred before you?

A. I was present when he came in the office. He asked to see the oath, which we gave him, and after he read it over, he said he could not take that oath, that he had taken an oath at the election before, and if he took this one, he should forswear himself. He did not think that any Christian could take the oath prescribed in the Constitution, and deemed to be registered as a qualified voter, without taking the oath. I believe this is about all.

A. I did not hear anything.

8th. Were you present when Beauchamp A. Wright applied to your Board for registration?

A. I do not consider that he did apply.

10th. In what form did you administer that part of the oath prescribed by the Registry Law?
