Thomas W. H. White, a witness called for and on behalf of Mr. John R. Franklin, being duly sworn deposes and says :

To the first interrogatory :

A. That he has resided in Somerset county nearly thirty-four years and been a voter therein about twelve years ; resided last year in Trappe District, in Somerset county.

2d.

A. That I did so apply : was notified in no way of any charge ; was confronted in no way with any witnesses ; they asked me if I would take the *oath*, said I would ; then they handed it to me, I read it, said again I would take it, then they handed me a Princess Anne paper (evidence of the paper objected to unless produced) and asked me if I could stand the preamble that was in that ; I told them I could with one exception, that was touching upon my sympathy for the Southern people ; I thought that no christian man could answer that as what they termed satisfactory, they said, well sir, you have saved us the trouble of swearing you.
