

-nd.

A. I did apply; was notified of no charge against me; was confronted with no witnesses; took the required oath.

3rd.

A. I did not vote; offered to vote for John R. Franklin; would not take my vote because I wasn't registered.

4th. Waived as to this witness.

Cross-examination:

1st. Have you since April 1, 1861 to 1st April, 1865, in any way favored the supply of the Government with men or money to prosecute the war?

A. No, sir.

2nd. At the battle known as the first battle of Bull Run, did you feel or express any regret at the defeat of the United States army?

A. Don't know of having felt or expressed any regret.

3rd. Did you feel or express any gratification at the triumph of the United States armies during the war?

A. Not that I mind of.

4th. Have you ever felt or expressed any regret at the defeat of the Federal armies during the war?

A. I believe not.

Re-direct examination:

1st. In the period from 1861 to 1865, how often have you voted?

A. Twice.

2nd. Have you ever voted during that period for any man for Congress, except Mr. Crisfield?

A. I have not.

3rd. At what election did you vote for Mr. Crisfield?

A. When Mr. Henry was opposed to him.

Question. Have you ever by any open act or deed, expressed your desire for the enemies of the United States to triumph over the United States?

Answer. I have not.
