A. I did apply; took the oath required of me; was notified of no charge; not confronted with witnesses.

3d.

A. I did vote; was not registered as a qualified voter; voted for Mr. Franklin.

4th. Waived.

A. I did hear of it; was in town.

Did you feel or express any regret at the defeat of the Federal army in that battle?

A. I did not.

Did you feel or express any regret at the fall of Fort Sumter?

Did you feel or express any gratification at the capture of Vicksburg?

A. Don't think I did.

Did you ever feel or express any gratification at the defeat of the Confederate armies?

A. Not that I know of.
