1st:

A. 53 years, been a voter 32 years; resided in 1865 in 4th election district.

2d:

A. Did apply; was notified of no charge; was confronted with no witnesses; took the oath; was not registered as a qualified voter.

3d:

A. Did not vote; because the paper stuck up showed I was disfranchised; went to the polls but did not offer to vote; would have voted for John R. Franklin.

4th: Waived.

Cross-Examination.

To the first cross-interrogatory:

A. Don't know that I did.

2d:

A. As I don't recollect much about that.

3d:

A. I don't recollect much about that.

4th:

A. I don't think you have any right to ask me; I decline to answer.

5th:

A. I decline to answer.
