THURSDAY, February 1, 1866.

Mr. Stephenson, of Harford, presented a petition of citizens of Harford county, asking the passage of a Boom Law.

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Vickers presented the petition of 100 citizens of Kent county, in favor of the repeal of the Registry law;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Elections.
