Ichabod Evans, a witness produced on behalf of Claimant, being duly sworn, answers and says to interrogatories filed this day, and called "Barren Creek interrogatories:"

In speaking of Hungry Neck I mean that portion of Barren Creek District known by that name. He said that I was not a loyal man, because I had given Mr. Holten, his own son, who was a blockade-runner, a dinner. I told him that he, (Mr. Holten,) ad given him a lundred during the war, and that I should like to give him another to-day, but he was at the Dry Tortugas. That's all the reason why I did not go before them. He said he had known me for twenty-two years, theen neighbors, and we had both been old Democrats.

3d.

A. Did not vote—would have voted for Mr. Franklin.

4th.

A. I have heard one or two democrats say they were not going for that reason.
