3d:

A. Did not vote; would have voted for Franklin; would have given him 100 if he could.

4th: Waived.

Cross-Examination:

To the first interrogatory:

A. I regretted the people of both armies were getting killed up; if the real secessionists were pitted against the abolitionists, I would not have cared.

2d:

A. I was very sorry when it fell.

3d:

A. I was sorry when the good people either side were killed; I cared nothing for the bad devils on either side.

4th:

A. I believe that I have over both, at times when I thought one needed a thrashing, and then another needed it; I took no papers during the war.

5th:

A. No.
