Wm. S. Moore, a witness produced on behalf of claimant, being duly sworn, answers and says:

To the first interrogatory:

A. Six years; been a voter six years; resided in 1865 in District No. 6.

2nd.

A. Did apply; took the oath; answered all the questions; no witness; no charge; I saw my name in the list of published voters. I was notified by a constable in this district to appear before the Registers, but I did not do so, as the constable said he didn't know what they wanted me for. I afterwards learned my name was struck off, and it was not on the list handed to the Judges of Election, and I didn't vote. The Registers did not tell me I was struck off. I have since examined the books of Registration, and I find my name was not struck off, but was entered in the eighth column, though it was not on the list handed to the Judges.

3d.

A. I offered to vote, but was refused, because my name was not on the list of qualified voters. Would have voted for Franklin.

4th. Waived.

Cross-Examination. Waived.
