To his Excellency,

The Governor of Maryland:

We, the subscribers, return Judges of Election Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, in Somerset county, at the close of an election held on Wednesday and Thursday, the twelfth and thirteenth days of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in the several Election Districts of Somerset county for the purpose of ascertaining the sense of the people in regard to the adoption or rejection of the Constitution submitted to them, this day attended the usual place of the sitting of the Circuit Court for Somerset county aforesaid, with the books of the polls on which are endorsed the several certificates agreeably to law, and having cast up and calculated the whole number of votes given in said Districts, according to the respective certificates made out by the Judges of said Districts, do return that there were four hundred and sixty-four votes cast "For the Constitution," and that there were two thousand and sixty-six votes "Against the Constitution." We further certify that the oath or affirmation prescribed by the Constitution submitted for adoption or rejection was administered to each and every person who voted before his ballot was received.
