

MEMORIAL.

To the General Assembly of Maryland:

The Memorial of the undersigned, citizens of Maryland, represents that the effect of the provision of the Constitution and Law, relating to the Registry of Voters in this State, has been to disfranchise permanently a large majority of those, who, before the adoption of these measures, were entitled to exercise the right of voting.

The circumstances under which these restrictions were imposed, no longer exist, and it is contrary to the spirit of Republican Institutions to compel men to bear the burdens of a Government in which they have no voice. Therefore, we respectfully Petition your Honorable Body to repeal or modify the Law so that all persons, who, under the old Constitution were entitled to vote, shall hereafter be allowed to exercise that right, upon taking the oath of allegiance to the Government of the United States, and to the State of Maryland.
