A bill to repeal from section thirty-one to section forty, inclusive, of article six of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to "Apprentices," and to strike out the words "white apprentices," occurring between the ninth and tenth sections of said article;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Colored Population.

A bill to amend and re-enact the second section of the Act, passed on the twenty-fourth day of March, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, entitled, an Act to provide for the registration of births, marriages and deaths;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
