STATE OF MARYLAND,

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT,

Annapolis, January 18, 1866.

I beg leave most respectfully to hand you herewith certain documents relating to the Antietam National Cemetery, together with a communication from Messrs. Shriver and Fulton, Trustees on the part of the State of Maryland.

These papers will show what has been done in carrying out the law of the State in reference to that work. The object of the State of Maryland appears to have been to tax herself with the purchase of the grounds in the preparation of the Cemetery for the reception of the remains of the gallant men,
