Mr. Ohr from the committee on Internal Improvements reported the bill in favour of Magnetic and American Telegraph company, with the following amendments;

Amend section 2, line 15 by inserting after the word "afore-said" "and shall publish the name of the consolidation in at least one newspaper published in the cities of New York, Philadelphia and Baltimore."

Amend section 4, by adding thereto "and the service of a summons or writ on any officer, agent, or attorney of said consolidated company; shall be a service of said summons or writ on said corporation and shall hold said corporation to answer before the tribunal from whence such summons or writ may be issued;"

Which were read and adopted.

The said bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
