Mr. Lusby moved that the memorial be referred to a select committee;

Which was decided in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Silver,

The memorial was referred to the committee on Elections.

On motion of Mr. King,

Ordered, That two thousand copies of the address delivered by the Speaker of this House, be printed for distribution by the members.

On motion of Mr. Cronise,

Ordered, That the Librarian furnish the members and officers of this House with the same amount of extra stationery and other articles furnished to this House last session.

On motion of Mr. Valliant,

Ordered, That the Rev. J. P. Hammond, be and he is hereby appointed Chaplain of this House in place of Rev. Mr. Davenport, who has removed from the State.

On motion of Mr. King,

Ordered, That His Excellency the Governor, be respectfully requested to have the national flag displayed from the State House dome daily, at the hour of the opening of the Houses during the session of the General Assembly, and lowered when the Houses adjourn.

On motion of Mr. Harris,

Ordered, That the clerk be and he is hereby directed to have printed and folded, five extra copies of the Journal of this House for the use of each member, and a like number for the use of the Chief Clerk and Reading Clerk, and that one copy be furnished to the publishers of each newspaper in the State.
