Mr. Smith, of Dorchester, presented a petition from William M. Travers and Solomon C. Smith, of Dorchester county, praying for the restoration of the elective franchise;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Registration.

Mr. Murkey presented a petition from forty-six ladies of Unionville, Frederick county, asking for the passage of a law prohibiting the sale of spirituous liquors in that vicinity;

Mr. Norris presented a petition from citizens of the fifth election district of Carroll county, praying for the passage of a law to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors within two miles of Freedom and Trinity churches, in said district;

Mr. Sherry presented a petition from one hundred and twenty citizens of Frostburg, praying the General Assembly of Maryland to authorize the commissioners of Allegany county to subscribe to the stock of the Western Maryland Railroad company;
