Leave was granted the Charles and St. Mary's counties delegations to report a bill entitled, an Act fixing the time for holding the circuit courts in the first judicial circuit.

Also, leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to report a bill entitled, an Act to amend the Act of 1865, chapter 126.

On motion of Mr. Hazen,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hazen, Poteet, Malone, Holloway and Wooden to report a bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections five, six and eight of an an Act passed at December session, 1825, chapter 24, and to enact substitutes therefor.

On motion of Mr. Fawcett,

Leave was granted the Montgomery county delegation to report a bill entitled, an Act to amend the charter of the town of Rockville.

Mr. Soper, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to provide for the payment of the Officers of Registration of this State their offices and expenses.
