Mr. Stewart, from a Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to prohibit the issuing of any license for the sale of spiritous or fermented liquors within the limit of the Fifth Election District of Howard county; and to prevent the sale of all kinds of intoxicating drinks within the limits of said district;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Pilkington, from the committee on Registration, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to add an additional section to the 69th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, "Officers;"

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Calvert submitted the following resolutions:

Resolved, That we regard the effort, now being made in Congress, to enlarge the powers and extend the jurisdiction of the 'Freedmen's Bureau' to States that have not been in rebellion, as an unwise interference between the employer and employee, and an infringement upon the constitutional rights of the States.
