Leave was granted the committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill entitled, an Act to repeal and re-enact the Acts passed January session, 1865, chapter 33, 49 and 196, and amend the same to authorize the Treasurer on the warrant of the Comptroller to pay such soldiers as have not been paid under said Acts.

On motion of Mr. Tome,

Leave was granted the committee on Finance to report a bill entitled, an Act to authorize the Governor, Comptroller and Treasurer to sell the State's interest in the stock of the city of Baltimore, and the York and Cumberland Railroad Company, standing to the credit of the sinking fund.

On motion of Mr. Tome,

Leave was granted the committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill entitled, an Act to repeal an Act passed January session, 1864, to encourage enlistments in this State, chapter fifteen, and re-enact and amend the same to discharge the registration of Baltimore city and the County Commissioners, and to require them to settle with the Comptroller and pay money on hand into the funds of the State, and authorize the Treasurer on the warrant of the Comptroller, to pay such bounties as may remain unpaid under said Act.
