The bill to restore the full rights of citizenship to all persons disqualified by the 4th section of article 1, of the Constitution from voting, and from holding any office of honor, profit or trust under the Laws of the State, was referred to Messrs. Clarke, Trail and Whitney.

Mr. Vickers, from the Select committee, reported a bill to secure the completion of the Kent county Railroad, by the Kent county Railroad company;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Lansdale, from the committee on Internal Improvements, reported a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Chesapeake Bay and Potomac River Tide Water company;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. McMaster presented the memorial of M. Blair and others to appear before the General Assembly, and present the proceedings of the Anti-Registration Convention held in Baltimore city;

Which was read.
