State, any convict or pauper, under the penalty of five thou-
sand dollars, to be collected as other fines are, the same to be
tried before a court of common jurisdiction;

Which was rejected.

Mr. Foster submitted the following amendment:

Amend to read after the word "lands," "outside the State
of Maryland;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Fawcett submitted the following amendment:

"Strike out the 12th section;"
