A bill entitled, an Act further to regulate the relation of creditor and debtor between the State of Maryland and the Susquehanna and Tide Water Canal Companies;

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize Grayson Eichelberger, State Bounty Commissioner of Frederick county, to pay Dennis H. Maynard certain bounties;

Severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to add an additional section to the 28th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the pay of county commissioners, and to repeal all the sections of the several articles of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the pay of county commissioners;

A bill entitled, an Act to protect timber of any kind whatsoever in Dorchester county;

Severally endorsed, "rejected."
