The pending amendment submitted by Mr. Valliant, was withdrawn.

Mr. Usilton submitted the following amendment:

Section 3. And be it enacted, That the money thus levied and collected from the white taxable inhabitants, be applied to white schools, and that collected from the colored people be applied to the colored schools;

Which was decided in the negative.

The bill having been read the second time, it was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
