

Mr. Markey moved to reconsider the vote by which the bill to enfranchise Wm. Thompson of R., and others, was rejected for want of a constitutional majority ;

The said bill was re-committed to the committee on Registration.

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections 194, 196 and 197 of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments ;

Was read the second time, amended, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
