Mr. Mackall, from the committee on Corporations to which was referred the bill incorporating the Mount Washington Mining company, reported it without amendment;

And it was read the second time.

Mr. McMaster, from the Select committee, reported a bill to authorize the Presbyterian congregation of Pitts Creek in Worcester county to sell and convey certain land;

Which was read the first time, by special order the second time, three-fourths concurring, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, read the third time by special order and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
