STATE ASSEMBLIES.

The Provincial Convention met June 24th, 1774, and under its authority the Constitutional Convention met on August 14th, 1776.

The Declaration of Rights was agreed to by the Convention on November 2d, 1776, and the Constitution on November 8th, 1776.

The first General Assembly, under the authority of the State, was convened by the Council of Safety February, 1777. The Constitution of 1776 provided that the Assembly should meet annually on the first Monday of November, and, if necessary, oftener.
