The Treasurer is elected by the General Assemby for a term of two years; all other officers are appointed by the Treasurer, and hold office during his pleasure.
STATE TAX COMMISSIONER—Annapolis.
State Tax Commissioner, Buchanan Schley
The State Tax Commissioner is appointed by the Governor, Comptroller and Treasurer for a term of four years from the date of his qualification; all other officers are appointed by the State Tax Commissioner, and hold office during his pleasure. The State Tax Commissioner is charged with the duty of valuing the capital stock of corporations for the purpose of taxation. He also has charge of the collection of tax on distilled spirits. Surety companies are required to report to the State Tax Commissioner, and to obtain from him a permit authorizing them to do business in this State.
STATE AUDITOR.
State Auditor, George B. AshCecil County1904
The Board of Public Works appoints one for a term of two years from the date of his qualification. It is the duty of the Auditor to examine the accounts of all Clerks of Courts, Register of Wills, Sheriffs, State's Attorneys and the Tobacco Warehouse, and make annual report to the Board of Public Works. (Chapter 257, 1902.)
LAND OFFICE—Annapolis.
Commissioner of the Land Office, E. Stanley Toadvine
The Commissioner of the Land Office is appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate, and holds his office during the term of the Governor by whom he is appointed: all other officers are appointed by the Commissioner, and hold their office during his pleasure.
STATE LIBRARY-Annapolis.
State Librarian, Mrs. Anne Burton JeffersAnne Arundel County1904 Indexer and Cataloguer, Louis H. Dielman
State Librarian is appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate, and holds office during his pleasure. The Indexer and Cataloguer is appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Library Committee, for a term of two years. (Chapter 272, 1900).
