An election for members of the First Branch of the City Council of Baltimore shall be held in the City of Baltimore on the Tuesday after the first Monday of November in every year; and for members of the Second Branch on the Tuesday after the first Monday of November eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and on the same day in every second year thereafter; and the qualification for electors of the members of the City Council shall be the same as those prescribed for the electors of Mayor. 1*

Sec. 4 The regular sessions of the City Council of sessions. Baltimore (which shall be annual), shall commence on he third Monday of January of each year, and shall not ontinue more than ninety days, exclusive of Sundays; Limitation. nt the Mayor may convene the City Council in extra ession whenever, and as often as it may appear to him hat the public good may require, but no called or extra Extra sessions ession shall last longer than twenty days, exclusive of undays.

Sec. 5. No person elected and qualified as Mayor, or a member of the City Council, shall, during the term r which he was elected, hold any other office of profit trust, created, or to be created by the Mayor and City puncil of Baltimore, or by any Law relating to the prporation of Baltimore, or hold any employment or sition, the compensation of which shall be paid, rectly or indirectly, out of the City Treasury; nor all any such person be interested, directly or indirectly, any contract to which the City is a party; nor shall it lawful for any person holding any office under the ty, to be interested, while holding such office, in any itract to which the City is a party.

Disqualifications.

Sec. 6. The Mayor shall, on conviction in a Court of Removal of w, of wilful neglect of duty, or misbehavior in office, removed from office by the Governor of the State, and uccessor shall thereafter be elected, as in a case of ancy.
