tion of another person in his place, of which election not less than ten days' notice shall be given, exclusive of the day of the publication of the notice and of the day of election; and f during the recess of the Legislature, and more than ten lays before its termination, such death shall occur, or such esignation, refusal to act or disqualification be communicated n writing to the Governor by the person so resigning, refusng or disqualified, it shall be the duty of the Governor to some a warrant of election to supply the vacancy thus creted, in the same manner the said Speaker or President might ave done during the session of the General Assembly; proided, however, that unless a meeting of the General Assemly may intervene, the election thus ordered to fill such vaency shall be held on the day of the ensuing election for elegates and Senators.

Sec. 14. The General Assembly shall meet on the first dednesday of January, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, Time of meeting on the same day in every second year thereafter, and at islature. o other time, unless convened by Proclamation of the Govnor.

SEC. 15. The General Assembly may continue its session long as in its judgment the public interest may require, for Limit of sessions. period not longer than ninety days; and each member thereshall receive a compensation of five dollars per diem for Compensation very day he shall attend the session, but not for such days he may be absent, unless absent on account of sickness or y leave of the House of which he is a member; and he shall so receive such mileage as may be allowed by law, not exeding twenty cents per mile; and the presiding officer of Mileage. ch House shall receive an additional compensation of three llars per day. When the General Assembly shall be con-Extra sesened by Proclamation of the Governor, the session shall not sions. ntinue longer than thirty days, and in such case the cominsation shall be the same as herein prescribed.

Sec. 16. No book, or other printed matter, not appertainto the business of the session, shall be purchased or sub-Books not to ribed for, for the use of the members of the General As-chased. ombly, or be distributed among them, at the public expense.

Sec. 17. No Senator or Delegate, after qualifying as such, iwithstanding he may thereafter resign, shall during the Disqualificaple period of time for which he was elected be eligible to y office which shall have been created, or the salary or offits of which shall have been increased, during such term.
