*Clerk of the Court of Appeals:* CALEB C. MAGRUDER (Democrat), of Prince George County.

Caleb Clarke Magruder, of Prince George County, son of Caleb Magruder, lawyer, and Mary Sprigg Belt, was graduated A. B. and A. M., Georgetown University. Studied law at the University of Virginia. Married Elizabeth Rice, daughter of Dr. Richard Thomas Nalle and Ellen Anne Hooe, of Virginia. Democratic candidate for State Senator from Prince George's in 1881, and for Associate Judge of Seventh Judicial Circuit in 1897. Elected Clerk of the Court of Appeals November 5, 1917.

At the elections of 1913 and 1919 Mr. Magruder was re-elected Clerk of the Court of Appeals for a term of six years.

*Comptroller of the Treasury:* E. BROOKE LEE (Democrat), Silver Spring, Maryland.
