violator shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than fifty dollars. The Board has power to annul certificates for intoxication while on duty.

It is also the duty of the Board to visit all steam plants wherein licensed engineers are employed and ascertain if such plants are being

run with proper skill and care.
