It is also the duty of the Board to visit all steam plants wherein licensed engineers are employed and ascertain if such plants are being run with proper skill and care.

Governor, with the consent of the Senate, appoints three for a term of two years from the first Monday in May. Two shall be adherents of the two leading political parties. (Ch. 591, 1902.)

It is the duty of this Board to examine all applicants for appointment to or promotion in the Police Force of Baltimore City, and to certify lists to the Police Commissioner from which all appointments and promotions are to be made. This is done by holding competitive examinations from time to time as the eligible lists expire, to find out the qualification of the person seeking appointment or promotion.
