

should be appointed by the Governor. The Inspector of Tobacco must be a tobacco grower or a duly qualified leaf-tobacco dealer, and a resident of one of the tobacco growing counties of the State. He has charge of the State Tobacco Warehouses and other property connected therewith in the City of Baltimore.

The receipts of the warehouse for 1921 were 33,818 hogsheads tobacco, the shipments were 35,507 hogsheads, and stock on hand January 1st, 1922, 16,626 hogsheads.
