Answer. I went to the polls on that day in Election District No. 10, where I was registered and offered my ballot, and it was rejected by the judges; I desired to vote for Alfred Spates for State Senator. The judges refused to take my vote unless I would take the oath again; I declined to take the oath, telling them I had been registered; I went away with-

out voting.

I asked them why they asked me to take the oath again; had I not been registered by a Register appointed by the Governor of the State? one of the judges replied then, that "the reason why that had to be done was, that the Governor himself was disloyal, and had committed several disloyal acts; If he had been a loyal man, we would have had none of this to do;" these are, as well as I can recollect, his words.
